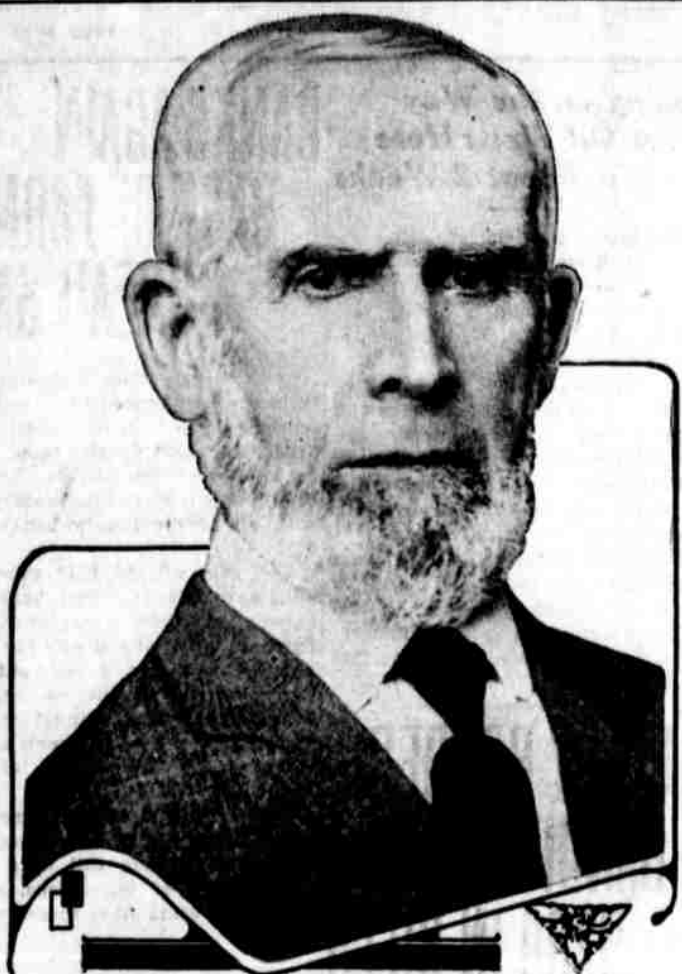


Quaker Minister Is Grateful to Tanlac

RECORD ATTENDANCE IN INDIAN SCHOOLS

ALTURAS, Cal., Jan. 17.—The attendance of Indian children of Modoc county on November 30, 1930, is the best record ever submitted to the commissioner of Indian affairs. The record has been made possible by co-operation of county officials county school districts and the Indian service employees. The attendance is thus analyzed:

In government school at Fort Bidwell, 56 boys, 38 girls, total 94. In other government schools, five boys, seven girls, total 12. In public schools, 11 boys, 26 girls, total 37. Not in any school, 17 boys, 17 girls, total 34. Total 89 boys, 88 girls, grand total 177.

Olcott's Plan Is Backed by Legion; 57 Members Vote

Governor Olcott's suggestion that the soldiers' bonus plan shall provide a cash payment of \$25 for each month of service, or the option of a loan of \$3000 for home building or for the operation of a farm, was endorsed by 57 members of Klamath post, American Legion, who met in the city hall Saturday.

The loan plan requires the loan to be paid at the rate of 5 per cent each year, 2 1/2 per cent as interest, and the remainder to be applied on the principal.

Eighty acres of Tule land, and 160 acres of marsh land were sug-

gested as practical as homesteads upon the lands of the Upper and Lower Klamath lakes, and Tule lake.

A hearty endorsement was given to the anti-Japanese legislation now being considered in several western states.

Another meeting will be held tomorrow night, when these issues will be discussed again. A bigger turnout is expected in order to lend more strength to the stand the legion is taking in the interest of its members.
