RESOLUTION DECLARING INTENTION TO MAKE STREET IMPROVEMENTS

The city engineer pursuant to resolution of the Common Council of the city of Klamath Falls, Oregon, having under date of December 11th, 1920, filed his plans, specifications and estimates of costs of improving Fourth street from southerly line of Klamath avenue to the southerly line of Oak avenue; Fifth street from the southerly line of Klamath avenue to the southerly line of Willow avenue; Walnut avenue from the northerly line of Fourth street to the southerly line of Sixth street; Oak avenue from the northerly line of Fourth street to the southerly line of Seventh street and Willow avenue from the northerly line of Fifth street to the southerly line of Sixth street, together with all intersections between the termini mentioned not already improved; Such improvement to consist in bringing said portions of said street to the established grade, and hard surfacing the same with Bitulithic, pavement to the following widths:

4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and westerly half of Lot 3, Blk. 97; Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, Blk. 104; Lots 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, Blk. 53; Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, Blk. 94; All of said lots and blocks above described being in Klamath addition to the city of Klamath Falls, Oregon, and said above listed lots and blocks is hereby declared to be the property to be assessed for the cost of making said improvements.

And be it further resolved, that Monday, the 7th day of February, 1921, at the hour of 8 o'clock P. M. at the Council Chamber in the city hall in said city be and hereby is fixed at the time and place for the hearing of objections and remonstrances against the making of said proposed improvement, and the Police Judge is hereby directed to cause notice of said hearing by publishing this resolution as by charter required.
