### IS COMPOSER AND VIRTUOSO

Fritz Kreisler, giving his first New York recital of the season, paid a compliment to Leopold Godowsky by using the pianist's composition "Weinerisch" on his program. In commenting on this concert, H. T. Finck said in the "Evening Post," "Godowsky's 'Weinerisch' evoked the spirit of Schubert, Lanner and the whole Strauss family. This piece made its mark with the audience." In the Brooklyn "Eagle," W. B. Murray said, "There is a mine of music in Godowsky's 'Weinerisch.'" At the most recent dual appearance in New York of Godowsky and Mox Rosen, the young violinist played "Weinerisch" and a waltz by Godowsky, both of which were received with great enthusiasm. "The musical leader" in speaking of his Chicago concert says, "His program was one of the finest ever offered in this city, but nothing he played was more beautiful or more interesting than the three numbers from his own 'Triakontameron,' which make lovely pieces for concert performances." Leopold Godowsky, the celebrated pianist will arrive in Klamath Falls tonight and will appear tomorrow night at the Scandinavian Hall under

the auspices of the Musical Study Club. Mrs. Mills, president of the club, talked to Miss Voldisch, his western manager, from Medford this morning and reports that Godowsky's concert there last night was a wonderful success. Mr. Godowsky responded graciously to numerous encores and the audience was boisterous to leave when it was over.

Mr. Godowsky is bringing a Knabe piano tuner with him who will put the instrument in perfect condition before the concert.
