RESOLUTION

A Resolution Declaring the Intention of the City of Klamath Falls to Change the Grade on Washington Street Beginning on the Easterly Line of Third Street and Extending from Third Street to Fifth Street.

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to change the present grade on Washington Street beginning on the easterly line of Third Street and extending from Third Street to Fifth Street, BE IT RESOLVED that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to change the grade to read as follows:

Beginning on Washington Street at the Easterly line of Third Street grades shall be established as follows:

Elevations.

South Sidewalk 225; South Curb 226; North Curb 226; North Sidewalk 226.5.

Thence on a uniform grade to center of block (or at 132 feet towards 4th St. 220, 223, 223, 225.75.

Thence on a uniform grade to the westerly line of 4th Street. 219, 222, 223, 224.5.

Thence to the easterly line of 4th street. 224, 226, 227, 228.0.

At 53.2 feet, 227.2, 229.2, 229.8, 232.0.

At 106.4 feet, 230.4, 232.4, 232.6, 235.5.

At 159.6 feet, 234.3, 236.9, 237.1, 239.0.

At 212.8 feet, 238.9, 242.7, 243.3, 245.25.

At 266.0 feet, 243.5, 248.5, 249.5, 251.5, and that at breaks in grade, curbs and sidewalks there are to be such vertical curves as the city engineer shall direct.

Preliminary reports on British trade for 1920 have been received by the United States Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce. According to the statement issued by the bureau the report shows imports of the United Kingdom as 1,936,742,120 pounds and exports (including re-exports of 1,597,974,984.) making the total foreign trade for the year 3,494,717,104 pounds against 2,589,540,889 in 1919 and reducing the unfavorable balance of trade by 284,000,000 compared with the earlier year.
