The City Engineer pursuant to the resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having under date of the 21st day of January, 1921, filed plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of improving Pine Street from Eleventh Street to Esplanade, including intersections; and the Common Council having taken the same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory.

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, That said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of Pine Street from Eleventh Street to Esplanade, including intersections, be and the same are hereby approved;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve said portions of Pine Street, in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates; said improvement to consist of paving said portions of Pine Street with Concrete, Bitulithic or Willite. The estimated cost of the improvement of said portions of said street by placing thereon either Concrete, Bitulithic or Willite to be \$12,652.90, said cost including grading, rolling, curbing and cement sidewalk.
