LOWER LUMBER
RATE PROMISEDSEATTLE, Wash., March 10.—
That representatives of railroad
lines east of Chicago fully ap-
preciate the possibilities in the way of
freight revenue to be derived in
moving northwest forest products
was made evident in a telegram re-
ceived by the West Coast Lumber-
men's association from Robert B.
Allen, secretary-treasurer.Mr. Allen attended a conference
of eastern railroad executives held
in Cleveland, O., and his telegram
is interpreted by R. D. Brown, as-
sistant secretary manager, to mean
that the railroads have shown the
first evidence of a realization of the
necessity of naming freight rates on
northwest lumber that will move the
product to the large lumber-con-
suming territory east of Chicago."Although no definite announce-
ment can as yet be made," said Mr.
Brown, "it is the opinion of those
closely familiar with the situation
that, regardless of the response
made to the request of the lumber
industry, voiced through the West
Coast Lumbermen's association, re-
questing the naming of lumber rates
that would restore the former re-
lationship with its competitors, that
the eastern lines will shortly an-
nounce material reductions in their
proportional rates on lumber from
this section."
