OREGON AGRICULTURAL COL-LEGE, Corvaills, Oregon, April 8 .--Practically all the county agents in Eastern Oregon have adopted work along the following lines: (1) Adoption of Grimm alfalfa, (2) Application of sulphur to alfalfa, (3) Silos. (4) Pest control, (5) Better

Many other plans were adopted in different counties. These are common, however, to most countles and are of fundamental importance from an economic standpoint.

For instance, there are more than 50,000 acres of alfalfa land the production of which may be increased from twenty to fifty per cent by the use of Grimm alfalfa.

There are 100,000 acres of alfalfa which will return a ton per acre for every dollar expended for sulphur or land plaster.

The cost of beef, wool and dairy production can be reduced from twenty to fifty per cent by feeding ensilage figuring the cost of ensilage production and feeding value in comparison with hay crops.

In some districts in certain counties, pests, chiefly rabbits and ground squirrels, are destroying more range and crops than the livestock. The Klamath county Farm Bureau handled ten and one-half tons of polson last year for its members at a great reduction in cost. In some counties farm bureau members instead of purchasing livestock indiscriminately at public sales and from speculators, pool their orders and have members of the organization select stock desired.

With difficult financial situations facing the farmers these efficiency factors become more important than
