COVINGTON, Ga., April 11.—John S. Williams, plantation owner, was convicted yesterday of murder in connection with the Jasper county peonage cases. The verdict carries a sentence of life imprisonment. The jury recommended mercy.

Williams was convicted of the murder of a negro farm hand whose body, bound and weighed down with a sack of rocks, was found in the Yellow river. The bodies of nine other negroes were found buried on the Williams farm, or elsewhere.
