Three New States Will Be Created

(Col. E. Hofer in the Manufacturer)

Within a decade three new states will be carved out of the immense domain still known as the west.

Two thirds of the area, four-fifths of the mineral wealth, three-fourths of the water power, and nine-tenths of the timber are in this vast area.

This great two-thirds area which grows the surplus grain and sugar and wool and live stock that feeds and clothes the nation, has only about one-fourth the representation in congress.

The three new states will be formed from the western slope of Colorado, from Northern Idaho and tributary territory from Washington and Montana, and another from Northern California and Southern Oregon.

These states will be called Lincoln, Columbus and Jefferson, to preserve the great national traditions surrounding these American political heroes, who discovered and founded free America.
