

NO PREMIUM ON ELOQUENCE IN PARLIAMENT

GLASGOW, March 21. (By Mail).—Contrary to a popular idea, nowhere does "fluency of speech" count for less than in the House of Commons...

"In Parliament it is not the set speech but the debating speech which is effective," he said in the course of his inaugural address as Lord Rector of Glasgow University.

"There is a great difference between men in the faculty with which they speak. Some men speak far above their general ability and some men far below it but a natural gift of speech is not necessary to secure success in public life."

"There have always been, and there are now in Parliament, men whose speaking when they began seemed hopelessly bad but who, nevertheless, have taken their place in the front rank of statesmen."

"In Parliament also there have always been, and there are now, men who from every point of view of form, or of style, make speeches which cannot be considered good, but there is in them a vital force and their utterances, however expressed, like an electric current convey that force to those who listen to them."

Eloquence, like genius, he said, was a thing apart and the eloquent man, like the poet, was "born and not made."

PLAGUE ADDED TO HORRORS

NEW YORK, April 16.—Bubonic plague, which some months ago appeared in Northern Manchuria, has crept southward until it now threatens the main supply of China, according to a letter received by G. D. Gold, of the Young Men's Christian Association, from Harbin, Manchuria, where Mr. Gold was stationed during the latter part of the war.

"The situation is rendered more serious," said Mr. Gold today, "by the fact that Manchuria is literally crowded with foreign exiles. There are not fewer than 600,000 Russians, who fled before the Bolshevik executioners, 250,000 Koreans, and thousands of Chinese who formerly lived in Siberia, but who have been driven into Manchuria by the Red armies."

"Concerted efforts are being made in cities and towns along the Chinese Eastern Railway to combat the plague, hospitals being established, and the victims isolated. Efforts also are under way to fight the source of the disease—the rats that carry the germ. Thousands of persons have

died, and been given hasty burial. Strict regulations have been put in effect to prevent affected persons getting beyond Harbin, and officials at Mukden, the next big center to the South, are on the watch for the first appearance of the plague.

"If the grain supply of Manchuria is cut off, the famine victims in Shanghai, Chihli, Honan, Shensi and Shansi will be doomed. Manchuria representatives of the American Red Cross, the Chinese Red Cross and the Y. M. C. A. have informed the Peking authorities of the danger and urged that grain buying and shipments be hastened."

LEGION HAS NO USE FOR FOES OF AMERICA

NEW YORK, April 18.—Hostility to the "hyphen and hyphenates" was pronounced here recently by F. W. Galbraith, r., National Commander of the American Legion, who, in a statement commemorating the fourth anniversary of the declaration by the United States of war against Germany, pledged anew the soldier organizations "faith in America, its traditions and its ideals."

"Four years ago tomorrow," said the statement, "we declared war against Germany. The hyphen, realizing that it was an ally of our enemy, promptly took cover. The hyphen dug in and hid its head, and so long as the roar of battle sounded, it maintained an exceedingly low visibility."

"Then there was an armistice, which signified that the danger was over; and with the passing of danger the hyphen crept back slowly into view. Finally it became bold and asserted itself with its old arrogance."

"This anniversary is a fitting time to serve notice on the hyphen and hyphenates that there may have been an armistice for our late enemies but there never can be an armistice with the hyphen. An honest adversary we can admire and forgive. We never can make a truce with those citizens who affirm allegiance to two masters."
