GLASGOW, March 21, By Mall) .-Contrary to a popular idea, nowhere does "fluency of speech" count for less than in the House of Commons. according to Andrew Bonar Law, who for 20 years, has been a member of Parliament and, until his recent resignation, was the government leader in the House. Mr. Bonar Law was speaking of the qualities that make for success in public life.

."In Parliament it is not the set speech but the debating speech which is effective," he said in the course of his inaugural address as Lord Rector of Glasgow University, "As in war the guns which may secure victory are not necessarily the biggest. but those which are placed in the best position, so in Parliament the heavier the calibre of the guns the better, but at all costs they must be quick firing.

"There is a great difference between men in the facility with which they speak. Some men speak far above their general ability and some men far below it but a natural gift of speech is not necessary to secure success in public life.

"There have always been, and there are now in Parliament, men whose spenking when they began seemed hopelessly bad but who, nevertheless, have taken their place in the front rank of statesmen. They did so because intellect is not a tool, but a hand, and they used their innate intellect and force to master the tool which was necessary for their work.

"In Parliament also there have al ways been, and there are now, men who from every point of view of form, or of style, make speeches which cannot be considered good, but there is in them a vital force and their utterances, however expressed. like an electric current convey that force to those who listen to them."

Eloquence, like genius, he asid. was a thing apart and the eloquent man, like the poet, was "born and not made." The former colleague of Lloyd George said he had heard very few eloquent speeches. He had, however, listened to many very fine rhetorical efforts but the difference between eloquence and rhetoric was as wide as the poles. Eloquence was "fire" and rhetoric, even at its best, was "fire-works." Eloquence also was always simple. There was nothing strained or mechanical about it and it was not by pilling up images but by the winged expression that the effect was produced.

No man could secure, still less could he retain the confidence of the House of Commons or of the country unless he had gained a reputation for "disinterestedness and sincerity," Mr. Bonar Law declared, and there was only one way in which such a reputation could be permanently retained and that was by the actual posses- gon: sion of those qualities. The strongest uman motive, he sense of duty."

In looking out upon life, it was right that they should strive to excel, but if it was merely a nelfish ambition there would be in that no "vision splendid."

## PLAGUE ADDED

NEW YORK, April 16 .- Bubonic plague, which some months ago appeared in Northern Manchuria, has crept southward until it now threatens the main supply of China, according to a letter received by G. D. Gold, of the Young Men's Christian Association, from Harbin, Manchuria, where Mr. Gold was stationed during the latter part of the war. Unless the plague can be checked, Mr. Gold asserts, the granary relied upon for the relief of millions of famine victims in North China will be cut

"The situation is rendered more serious," said Mr. Gold today, 'by the fact that Manchuria is literally crowded with foreign exiles. There are not fewer than 600,000 Russians, who fled before the Bolshevik executioners, 250,000 Koreans, and thousands of Chinese who formerly lived in Siberia, but who have been driven into Manchuria by the Red armies.

'Concerted efforts are being made in cities and towns along the Chinese Eastern Railway to combat the plague, hospitals being established, and the victims isolated.
