

BIG MACDOEL TRACT OF FARM LAND IS SOLD

DORRIS, Cal., April 20.—A real estate transaction involving 7,000 acres of land in this valley near Macdoel by which parties from Kansas City, Mo., and Lodi, Cal., become the new owners has just been announced. C. E. Doty of San Francisco, closed the deal.

Five thousand acres were sold to Kansas City parties who will begin immediately to clear and break it. They have several carloads of machinery enroute to put the land into cultivation. The new owners plan to raise stock on a big scale. Rye and barley will be the principal crop for a few years, after which alfalfa will be tried.

The remaining 2000 acres purchased by Lodi people will also be farmed this year.

Both of these tracts lie partly under the newly organized Butte Valley irrigation district. The completion of the project will greatly enhance the value of all lands coming within its reach. Owing to the fertility and accessibility of the land in this valley, the addition of water will make it one of the richest agricultural districts in northern California.

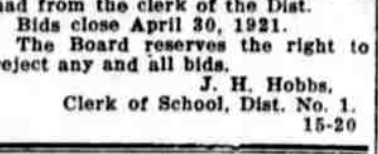
