CLUB WORKERS HOLD ROUSING MEETING

A rousing meeting of county club members and parents from the Fairview, Mt. Laki, Spring Lake, Lone Pine and Henley districts was held Friday evening at Henley to listen to addresses by Miss Henley Cowgill, assistant state club leader, and local club workers.
