# BARNES CIRCUS

Flaring posters of the Al. G Barnes hig 4-ring Wild Animal Circus have announced the coming of that favorite organization to Klamath Falla, Monday, May 2, and consequently there is great rejoicing in juvenile circles, and among the older perosns as well, for the lure of the circus never diminishes with age.

During the past winter the Barnes circus occupied for the first time the magnificent winter quarters recently acquired by Mr. Barnes. It comprises 86 acres west of Culver City, California, on Washington boulevard, and is pronounced by all circus folks who have visited it to be the finest show quarters in the country.

Every facility for the proper care of animals has been provided and the ease with which the dumb beasts absorb the lessons worked out for them by their trainers is taken as an indication that they appreciate the care that has been given to their comfort.

The Barnes circus has always been the pioneer in evolving new animal acts, and 1921 will be no exception to the rule. 
