

DEAD CATTLE BARON'S LAND WILL BE SOLD

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., April 29.—The remains of the vast empire of the late Henry Miller, cattle baron, who rose from a butcher boy to the largest individual land owner in the United States, are for sale according to announcement by David Brown, secretary of Miller & Lux, a holding corporation.

The lands are valued at \$40,000,000. They include one tract of 500,000 acres with a frontage of 70 miles along the San Joaquin river, and large holdings elsewhere in California, Oregon and Nevada.

Decision to sell was reached, Brown said, because of prolonged litigation over inheritance taxes computed in millions of dollars, and because of the company's determination to pay its debts of several million dollars. Difficulties encountered in managing the vast estate, realization that none of the Miller heirs will be able to control the property, and public opinion that the lands should be divided, also played a part in the decision.

Shortly before Miller's death in October, 1916, experts said that his land holdings were so extensive that even the owner himself had no exact knowledge of them.

Figures compiled and announced during Miller's lifetime gave the following as his holdings:

Santa Clara county, eight square miles.

Merced county, 36 miles north and south by 22 miles east and west.

Fresno county, 1,000,000 acres. Oregon, approximately 70,000 acres, mostly in Harney and Malheur counties.

Nevada, approximately 3,500,000 acres.

The passing of the Miller lands to other hands will close one of the romantic chapters in the history of the west.

Girl Who Figured In Slaughter Case Released From Home

SAN FRANCISCO, April 29.—Gertrude Lamson, star witness against Madison Slaughter, former Chico pastor, now serving a term at San Quentin prison for offenses against the girl, has been released from St. Catherine's school for girls here.

Superior Judge Gregory of Butte county, who authorized her release from the school after having been there five years, said that she had developed into a remarkable young woman, now 29 years old.

Slaughter has been seeking parole from the state prison for several months and his application is to be acted upon by the state prison board soon.

The Madison Slaughter case at Chico created a state-wide sensation early in 1916. While the girl, who was then but 15 years of age, insistently charged that she had been wronged by the minister, her parents maintained their belief in the pastor's innocence throughout the trial. Slaughter was sentenced to imprisonment May 17, 1916. Shortly afterward the superior court of Butte county, sitting as a juvenile court, declared the girl a delinquent and remanded her to the custody of a juvenile protective organization.

TAX ON BACHELORS

HONOLULU, T. H., Mar. 5. (By mail)—Bachelors and bachelor maids of Hawaii will be taxed more heavily, if a bill introduced in the territorial house by Representative Jarrett becomes a law.
