Will Not Recognize **Rank In Honoring** The Country's Dead

PARIS, April 19.-(By Mail)-No distinctions of rank will be made in marking the graves of Ameriean soldiers who died in France, says Charles S. Pierce, chairman of the American commission, which has arrived here to prepare plans for beautifying the four permanent military cemeteries where the bodies of all the American fighters are to be gathered.

"We shall try to make these cemeteries memorials of which all Americans will be proud," said Colonel Pierce. "Early in the discussions we decided that regardless of rank and position each grave should be treated in the same manner and given equal attention. The only variation permitted will be on the uniform headstones. On the top of these relatives may inscribe any religious emblem they wish so long as it does not interfere with the uniformity of the stone.

"No special monuments will b: permitted. All the Americans died in the performance of their duty and, no matter how heroic individuals may have been, the feeling of the nation seems to be that all should be accorded the same honor. "It is impossible to say now just what form the beautification will take but money will not be spared in making the cemeteries the most imposing in the world. Congress has appropriated \$1,000,000 as a preliminary sum for this work with a promise of more. It is probable that \$3,000,000 will be expended.
