RESOLUTION

The City Engineer pursuant to the Resolution of the Common Council heretofore adopted, having under date of the 1st day of April, 1921, filed plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of improving High street from Third street to the westerly line of Cedar street and Cedar street from High street to Pine street, including intersections; and the Common Council having taken the same under advisement and finding said plans, specifications and estimates satisfactory.

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, That said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of High street from Third street to the westerly line of Cedar street and Cedar street from High street to Pine street, including intersections, be and the same are hereby approved.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Common Council hereby declares its intention to improve said portions of High street and Cedar street in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates; said improvement to consist of paving said portions of High street and Cedar street with Bitulithic, Concrete or Willite. The estimated cost of the improvement of said portions of said street by placing thereon either Bitulithic, Concrete or Willite to be \$20,125.10, said cost including grading, rolling, curbing and cement sidewalk.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL, That the following described property be and is hereby declared benefited by said improvement, to-wit: Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 Block 6 Ewauna Heights, Lots 5, 6, 7, 8 Block 6, Original Town, Lots 5, 6, 7, 8, Block 5, Original Town, Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 Block 5, Ewauna Heights, Lots 6, 7, 8, Block 4 Original Town, Lots 1, 2, 3, Block 4 Ewauna Heights, Lots 3 and 4 Block 3, Original Town, Lots 1 and 2 Block 3, Ewauna Heights, Lots 4, 5, 6, Block 2 Original Town, Lots 1, 2, 3, Block 1, Ewauna Heights, Lots 1 and 2 Block 2 Original Town, Lots 1 and 2 in Block 3 Original Town; and that said property above listed and described be and hereby is declared to be assessed for the expense of said improvement.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Monday the 23 day of May, 1921, at the hour of 8 o'clock P. M., at the Council Chambers at the City Hall, be fixed as the time and place for the hearing of objections and remonstrances against the said proposed improvement and the Police Judge is hereby directed to cause notice of said hearing to be published as by Charter provided.
