Persons inspired by motives of that kind usually do not work in the open but accomplish their ends by secret creation of prejudice. Undoubtedly efforts of this nature were made in recent political campaigns but it is to the credit of all the wellestablished patriotic societies that none of them fell victim to the wiles of designing politicians. In the tense nervous strain of the after-war period it is easy to stir up antagonism by merely pointing the accusing finger and whispering 'pro-German' or 'pro-British' or pro-anything-else. As




