BLY, May 12.—The wedding of Mrs. Anita Labaree and Mr. Elmer Lowery took place Wednesday, May 4, at Yreka, California.

Anita Labaree, widow of Oscar G. Labaree and heir to his \$100,000 es-

tate, was in the limelight for several weeks last fall during the trial here of the contest of the son and daughter of her first husband to break the will which made her sole legatee.

The legal battle is still far from ended, as the decision of the probate in favor of the widow has been appealed to the circuit court, and attorneys for both sides have promised to carry the litigation to the highest courts before a judgment is accepted.

Oscar G. Labaree, railway builder and contractor, was a strong figure in the northwest for the two decades preceding his death at Bly two years ago. Following his divorce from his first wife and marriage to Anita Rhodes, he purchased the Bly ranch and lived quietly for the short time that was left him.

Persons here who know the bridegroom say that he is a very young man, barely out of his teens. Close friends set his age at about 29 years. His parents are ranchers in the Bly district, it was said.

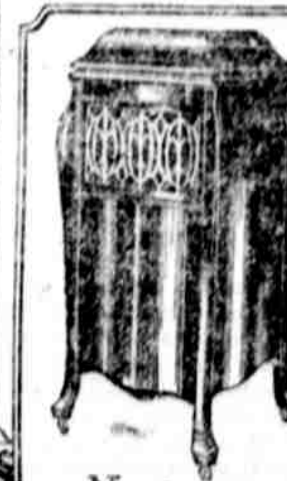
