WESTERN WASHINGTON IS GROWING EGG CENTER CENTRALIA, Wash., May 12.—Egg production has increased so rapidly in western Washington that there are now, in the section, approximately 1,250,000 hens producing 15,000,000 dozen eggs annually. Four years ago western Washington did not produce enough eggs to meet local demands and 100 cars were shipped in. Last year all local demands were met and 177 cars shipped to outside points. Officers of the Washington Cooperation Egg and Poultry association say their organization is second in size only to one at Petaluma, Calif.

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, That said plans, specifications and estimates for the improvement of Eleventh Street from Main Street to Klamath Avenue, including intersections, be and the same are hereby approved.

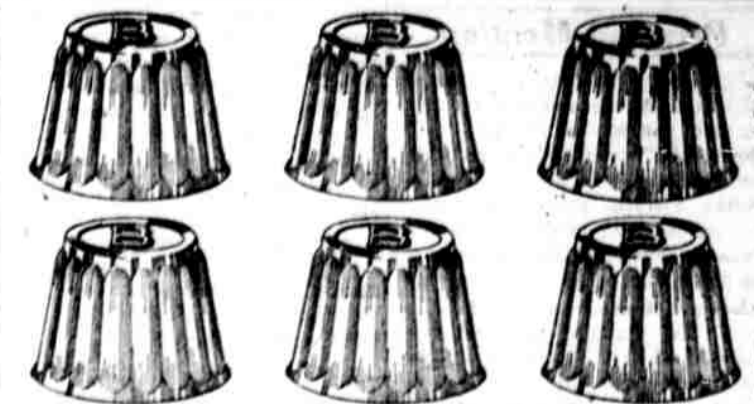
