Wages of British Labor Reduced

LONDON, April 28.—(By Mail)—More than 350,000 workers in Great Britain suffered reductions in wages last month amount to 40,000 pounds a week, and 110,000 received increases amounting to about 2,900 pounds a week. 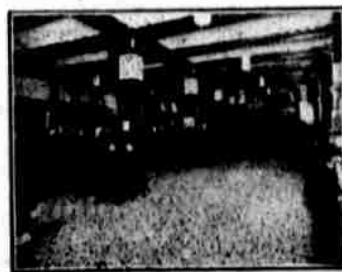
