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WILL RETAIN PLACE ON SEA

Admiral Benson Says America Has Made A Place for Herself And Will keep it.

LONDON, April 27 (Associated Press correspondence) — Admiral Benson, chairman of the United States Shipping Board, writing on the future of the American Merchant Marine in the publication "Fairplay," says: "America is upon the sea to stay. Who can doubt that she will, after witnessing the wonderful, almost undreamed of, accomplishments during the World War? 'America has expended \$4,000,000,000 to make a place for herself upon the seas, and has made that place, and will undertake earnestly to retain it, there is sufficient commerce for all the nations to thrive upon. 'It should not be forgotten that the ruthless enemy practically wiped out a good part of the most efficient type of our overseas shipping. If America had not by its shipbuilding made up for this lack in world shipping ocean rates would be soaring today. 'I, for one, am optimistic as to the future of the American Merchant Marine. The shipping of the entire world is now in a period of depression, but I believe that within a short time we shall see a turn for the better; in fact, even now there are indications of a revival. 'We are now shipping independent
