## WOOD SURPLUS GOING TO CAL.

The wood business is rather peculiar this year. Prices in Klamath Falls are lower at present than they were this time last year.

California buyers on the contrary are offering more for blocks than they did last summer and are buying more of the local product than ever before.

Some dealers below have asked for a special rate on slab-wood from Klamath Falls to points in California, which, if granted, will enable local dealers to dispose of large quantities of slab-wood from the saw mills to dealers in Dunsmuir, Red Bluff, Chico and other S. P. towns where wood is scarce.

Almost every day the south bound freight contains a car of block-wood and for the past week or two it has been nothing unusual to see two and three cars of blocks go out in one train.

Mr. Shallock, of the Ewauna Box company, Mr. Sitzer, of the Chelsea Box company, and Mr. Peyton, of O. Peyton & Co., have been interviewed on the matter and they all give practically the same answer, which is, that at present there are plenty of blocks, that the home market is supplied first, after which the surplus is loaded on cars and shipped to consumers in northern California.

They say that there is no cause for alarm among local consumers for the present as local trade is served first, but for such consumers as are particular about block-wood for winter use the safe plan would be to start laying it in at once.

The strong demand for blocks from below seems to be caused by the high price of coal which is still selling at war prices.

## OREGON BREVITIES

ASHLAND, June 10.—The children's playgrounds in Lithia park have opened for the summer season. Mrs. H. L. Homeswood of Eugene is supervisor, in charge of all activities including baseball, volley ball, and kindergarten work. Swimming lessons will be given at the natatorium with no age limit of charge. The city budget provides for the expense.

BAKER, June 10.—Work on the shaft that is being sunk on lower Powder river for the purpose of developing coal measures, is making good progress.

SALEM, June 10.—The total fire loss in Oregon outside of Portland for the month of May was \$388,910, according to the monthly report of A. C. Barber, state fire marshal.

EUGENT, June 10.—Lumber shipments over the Southern Pacific have reached the amount shipped over the road at this time last season, from 350 to 375 cars going to Southern and Eastern points every day through Eugene, according to District Agent I. T. Sparks. Lumber shipments of late have increased until they are now normal. Many yards and mills are being cleaned up according to Mr. Sparks.

PORTLAND, June 10.—Prospects for a prune crop have materially improved during the last week, according to reports received by the Oregon Growers' Cooperative association. In many districts where reports of two weeks ago indicated total failure, closer inspection of prune orchards promise a 25 per cent crop.
