Tule Lake Land Case to Trial

Much interest has been created in Malin, and Modoc county, California, arising from the case of G. W. and Lillie A. Myers against the United States which comes up for a hearing before Herbert D. Newell, project manager of the Klamath Reclamation project on June 20 in either Malin or this city.

The plaintiffs, G. W. Myers and wife, have instituted suit against the United States for \$5,755 damages alleged to have been received to their property lying on the east border of Tule lake by the recession of the waters of Tule lake, caused by the construction of Link River dam and the diversion canal being put in by the government.

This case has attracted much attention near Malin, as has the case of Jay P. Harter, who alleges that his land has been damaged on the California side to the extent of \$10,000 and his suit is pending in the court at Sacramento, Cal., now.

According to Attorney Carnahan, who is acting as the attorney for the plaintiffs, about 50 acres are affected in this individual case and the contentions that the plaintiffs set up is that this 50 acres was sub-irrigated previous to the lowering of the lake nearly 20 feet by the Klamath project and now the land is alleged to be sterile and non productive.
