Nature is consistent after all. The sun which reddens the back of the amateur gardener's neck also puts the red on the cheeks of the strawberries.

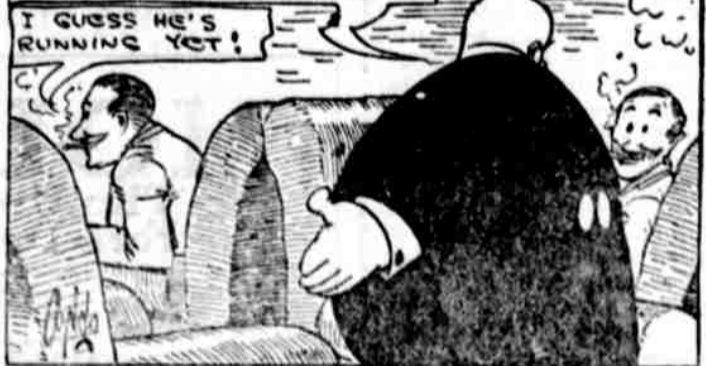

CLEVELAND, June 15. — Four women today stand formally charged with the murder of Daniel F. Kaber, who was stabbed 24 times by hired assassins at his Lakewood home two years ago.

Assaultants Not Paid According to the newspaper, Chief Christensen said Mrs. Kaber had declared that she had refused to pay the two foreigners when they reappeared after the funeral, asserting they had not fulfilled the role of ghosts as she had intended and that she would not involve herself by paying for murder.

Mrs. Kaber was then said to have fled to New York to escape the foreigners without advising the Cleveland police for fear of involving herself.

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
