SAN FRANCISCO, June 16.—The Southern Pacific Company's Sunset Limited, running between San Francisco and New Orleans was held up this week by a woodpecker—a red-headed one.

The Limited was clicking off the miles toward El Paso when a block signal dropped, forcing the engineer to stop and giving the flagman an opportunity to stretch his legs until the next clear block showed against the horizon. No train was in sight.

Investigation disclosed the fact that a red-headed woodpecker, one of the busy kind that builds its nest in the tops of telegraph poles in the mesquite country, had become interested in semaphore No. 3967 and had pecked away the lead wire to the track relay post just east of the signal.
