State Bar May Pass on Candidates for U. S. Dist. Attorney

Herald Washington Bureau WASHINGTON, June 29.—Opposition to the possible appointment of Pat Gallagher of Ontario as United States attorney for Oregon has developed in so many quarters that it is probable that no appointment for this office will be made or recommended by the Oregon senators until the motion has been submitted to the Oregon Bar association.

At last there will be no appointment to this office which is unsatisfactory to the association.

Bar to be Consulted

It is recognized that this position requires a lawyer of ability who is acceptable to the bar association and the present plan is to make the recommendations in conformity with the expression of the members of the Oregon bar.

This will in a sense remove the office from the political arena and dispose of it upon the question of legal attainments and peculiar fitness for the office.

The candidates for United States district attorney are: Arthur I. Moulton, Barge E. Leonard and H. M. Tomlinson of Portland; George Neuner of Roseburg; P. J. Gallagher of Ontario and Julien A. Hurlley of Vale.

WHEREAS, The State Game Commission of the State of Oregon is desirous of protecting the trout and other game fish inhabiting and frequenting the waters of Seven Mile Creek and all tributaries thereof, the waters of Woods River and all tributaries thereof, and the waters of the Klamath River for a distance of four thousand feet below and two thousand feet above the mouth of Spencer Creek, situated within the County of Klamath, State of Oregon;

NOW, THEREFORE, Notice is hereby given by the State Game Commission of the State of Oregon, that the waters of Seven Mile Creek and all tributaries thereof, the waters of Woods River and all tributaries thereof, and the waters of the Klamath River for a distance of four thousand feet below and two thousand feet above the mouth of Spencer Creek, situated within the County of Klamath, State of Oregon, are closed to angling or fishing by any means whatsoever, for trout or other game fish, from the 30th day of November to the 15th day of June of each year.

And it is and shall be unlawful for

any person to take or fish for trout or other game fish, by any means whatsoever, in the waters of said Seven Mile Creek and all tributaries thereof, the waters of Woods River and all tributaries thereof, and the waters of the Klamath River for a distance of four thousand feet below and two thousand feet above the mouth of Spencer Creek, situated within the County of Klamath, State of Oregon, from the 30th day of November to the 15th day of June of each year.

Any and all persons whosoever so angling or fishing in violation of this order will be prosecuted as by statute provided.
