WORLD PRESS MEET, OCTOBER, IN HAWAII

HONOLULU, Territory of Hawaii, July 5.—Press associations and organizations of newspaper men and writers in every country are invited to send official delegates to the Press Congress of the world, which meets for its 1931 session at Honolulu next October. The Executive Committee of the Congress has provided for representation of such associations on the basis of one voting delegate for every 20 members in their organizations. The names, addresses and professional connections of delegates should be reported to Dr. Walter Williams, president of the congress, who is dean of the school of Journalism of the University of Missouri at Columbia.

Special concessions in transportation and hotel accommodations which have been obtained for the journalists who will attend the meeting at Honolulu will be reserved for accredited delegates holding credentials issued by the Executive Committee and signed by Doctor Williams. Only those who hold credentials will have a voice in the business sessions at Honolulu or will be the guests of the Hawaiian government and press in their elaborate entertainment program.

The Executive Committee's provision for representation in the Congress is such that every bona fide newspaper man or woman in every country of the world may obtain delegate's credentials. Regarding this question the Congress constitution says: "Workers in every department of journalism, in every country, who are engaged in promoting highest standards and largest welfare of the press, are eligible to membership."

HAWAII TO IMPORT SAGE FOR HONEY PRODUCTION

LOS ANGELES, Cal., July 7.—California sage and certain varieties of flowers for experimental purposes in connection with bee culture and honey production in the Hawaiian Islands will be introduced in the insular territory soon by O. St. John Gilbert of Honolulu, who recently visited this section for the purpose of collecting botanical specimens.

Mr. Gilbert is said to be one of three largest producers of honey in world, and with his brother, founded the Hawaiian honey industry more than 25 years ago. The islands now produce annually, it is known, approximately 1000 tons of honey.
