MARSHFIELD HAS WELCOME READY FOR STATE ELKS

A. E. Whitman is the only Elk in this city who has definitely announced his intention to attend the state convention of the B. P. O. E. at Marshfield from August 18 to 20, inclusive. Last fall, according to Exalted Ruler A. C. Hayden, between forty and fifty members of Klamath Lodge, 1247, announced that they would make the trip but now within a month a number have had to withdraw their applications owing to business affairs interfering.

The delegates to represent the local lodge have not been selected and will not be until C. A. Hayden, exalted ruler, can appoint members who are free to attend this big meeting. According to the plans announced by the Marshfield lodge, the entertainment will consist of trap shooting for Elks only, Coos River excursion for forty miles as a treat to the lady Elks, smoker for men only, and dances, the first day. The second day will start with bands from Portland, Salem, McMinnville and Medford, competing in concerts; Coquille valley excursion, water carnival, hydroplane and airplane novelties; boat races between sailors on U. There will be a sea food beach dinner, days of '49 and a mardi gras.
