Red Cross Gives Aid To 4000 Veterans

WASHINGTON, July 25.—Through an appropriation by Congress there is now available to disabled veterans of the World War who are being retrained by the Federal Board for Vocational Education a revolving fund of \$550,000 from which they may borrow to meet temporary financial needs. Disabled ex-service men whose applications for training are still in "investigation status" are not eligible to this assistance but they will continue to receive such assistance from the American Red Cross, it is announced by National headquarters. During the last year 4,000 such men have been given temporary financial assistance by the Red Cross.
