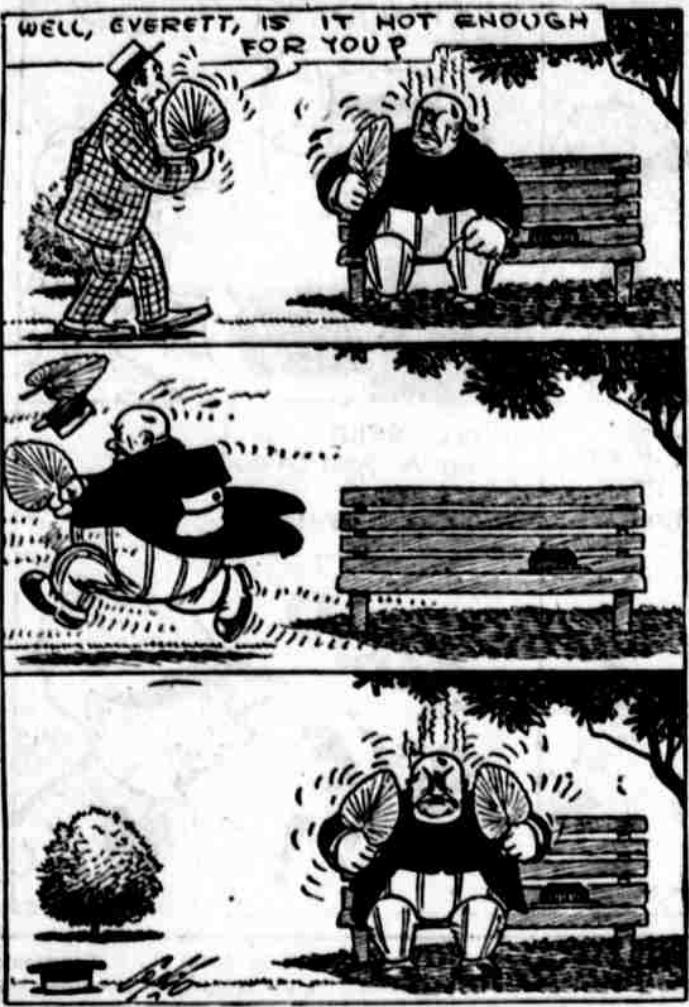

K. OF C. GAINS 87,000 IN YEAR

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Aug. 3.—William J. McGinley of New York, supreme secretary of the Knights of Columbus, reported to the international secretary here yesterday that the year ended June 30, 1921, had witnessed a net gain in members of 87,660.

The total American membership of K. of C. is now 755,155, his report shows, New York leading with 107,649. The sum of \$1,114,747 was awarded by the K. of C. in death benefits during the period covered in the report.

Members to the number of 2262 of the K. of C. died during the 12-month period covered in the report. There was an increase of 119 in the number of K. of C. councils, amalgamations of various councils in large cities affecting the proportionate growth of K. of C. units, the report said.

K. of C. councils and their entire memberships participated in two national charity drives on a large scale, the Herbert Hoover European relief council drive and the campaign for the committee on relief in Ireland—as well as in many local charity appears. The report estimates that the K. of C. were instrumental in raising between four and five million dollars for these causes. The Knights also transmitted to Cardinal Mercier approximately 350,000 francs for his Belgian reconstruction work.

His report estimated that by 1922 the K. of C. net membership would approximate the million mark, and stated that during the year five new state jurisdictions had been erected in North and South Carolina, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick.

CHARTER AMENDMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOERS BY THE COUNCIL

An Act
To amend the character of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, entitled "A bill proposed by initiative petition for an act to inact, provide and adopt a charter for the City of Klamath Falls, Klamath County, Oregon, to be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Klamath Falls,

Klamath County, Oregon, for their approval or rejection at a special election to be held in said city on the 10th day of March, 1913" submitted to and approved by the legal voters of said city on the 10th day of March, 1913, as subsequently amended by the legal voters of said city at the special election held therein on the 14th day of November, 1916, and to amend all other amendments thereto.

SECTION 309. (a) For the purpose of providing funds for sewerage purposes the council of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and dispose of general obligation sewer bonds of said city in the sum of \$50,000 in denominations of \$1000 or \$500 each, duly signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Police Judge under the corporate seal of the city, having semi-annual interest coupons thereto attached bearing the engraved fac-simile signatures of the Mayor and Police Judge, whereby the city shall be held in substance and effect to undertake and promise to pay the bearer of each of said bonds at maturity thereof the sum therein named in gold coin of the United States of the present standard of value with interest thereon in like gold coin at the rate of not to exceed six per cent (6%) per annum, payable semi-annually, said bonds to be known as City of Klamath Falls Sewer Bonds, said bonds to be dated August 1, 1921, and to mature in not to exceed fifteen years from date of issue, principal and interest to be payable at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York City.

(b) The debt limitations contained in the charter of said city shall not apply to the bonds hereby authorized.

(c) The council shall each year at the time of making the annual tax levy for city purposes include in such levy a sum sufficient to pay interest due on the outstanding bonds of this issue, and shall in addition thereto levy an additional amount sufficient to pay said bonds at their date or dates of maturity.

RESOLVED FURTHER that this resolution for proposed charter amendments submitted to the voters by the council be filed with the Police Judge of the City of Klamath Falls for submission to the legal voters of said city, for their rejection or approval to be voted upon at a special election to be held as herein provided;

Resolved further that the council deem it advisable and does hereby and herein call and make necessary provision for the holding of a special election which shall be and hereby is called to be held on the 12th day of August, 1921, between the legal voting hours on said date, and that said time be and the same hereby is designated as the time for

holding said special election, and the following polling places in said city are hereby designated as the polling places therefor, to-wit:
First Ward—Brown's carpenter shop, cor. Main and Center.
Second Ward—City Hall.
Third Ward—Buesing's Real Estate Office.
Fourth Ward—Mills Addition Hall.
Fifth Ward—Chas DeLap House, cor. Upham and Wordan, and the following named persons are hereby designated and appointed as and for the judges and clerks of said election, to-wit:

BE IT RESOLVED that the ballot title for said proposed charter amendments shall be in words and figures substantially as follows:
CHARTER AMENDMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOERS BY THE COUNCIL
An Act
To amend the charter of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, same being an act submitted to and approved by the voters of said city at a special election held therein on March 10, 1913, as subsequently amended at the special election held therein on November 14, 1916, and to amend all other amendments by adding Section 309 providing for an issue of sewer bonds in the sum of \$50,000.00 and for a tax levy to pay principal and interest thereon.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Police Judge be and he is hereby instructed to publish the hereinabove proposed charter amendments submitted to the voters by the council in the manner provided by law; that is to say, by publication of this resolution in full for two consecutive publications within the fifteen days immediately preceding said special election in The Evening Herald same being a newspaper published in the City of Klamath Falls and hereby designated for said purpose.
