Eight Years in the Hospital Fails to Cure Fever Carrier

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 6.—Harry Olsen, classed by doctors as a "typhoid carrier," has spent the years since 1912 in the United States marine hospital here and cannot yet see the end of his days of illness.

Rather than spread the disease, he voluntarily entered the hospital when sailors caught the typhoid from him while he worked as deckhand years ago aboard the lumber steamer Acme, plying between San Francisco and Mendocino county, California.

Four deaths resulted from typhoid aboard the vessel, she became known as the "fever ship" and men refused to sign aboard her. A careful examination of the crew and ship revealed Olsen as a "typhoid carrier" and he entered the hospital in an effort to rid himself of the unenviable faculty. Doctors say he has not yet been cured. Olsen ranks as an orderly in the hospital.
