## OREGON BREVITIES

**PENDLETON**—With a 14-month-old baby in her arms and leading her 2-year-old twins, Mrs. Earl Purcell was badly burned on the back, shoulders, neck and arms while fighting her way through a fire which destroyed the upper story of the MacMaster apartment house here. The children sustained severe burns also, but the condition of none of the family is thought serious. Damage to the building is placed at \$1500.

**GOLD HILL**—On the eve of a large acreage of wheat seeded under the Gold Hill irrigation district, which will come into production next season, the north end of Jackson county has just harvested the largest hay crop in the history of the region. With a large export trade in hay gone, formerly enjoyed by this valley in supplying the lumber camps and mines, where horses and oxen have been supplanted by auto trucks and donkey engines, the pressing need of the farmer is moer cattle, especially dairy cows, to feed these crops on the farm.

**PORTLAND**—Business with the west coast of South America, which has been dormant for several months, appears to have experienced a sharp revival under the influence of more favorable exchange rates with the South American countries. After several months without any boats at all leaving Portland for the South American west coast, four are being despatched this month.

**SALEM**—Men teachers in Marion county receive an average monthly salary of \$145, while women teachers are paid an average monthly salary of \$103.83. J. A. Churchill, state superintendent of schools, said the ratio of difference in salaries paid men and women teachers in Marion county applied to practically all sections of the state.

**PENDELTON**—A severe electrical storm, with a brief but vigorous downpour of rain, covered Umatilla

county but resulted in little damage. Harvesting operations will be held up for a couple of days but as only about 10 per cent of the county's grain crop is still standing, the loss will be small. Farmers are still holding their grain for a dollar, and few sales are reported.

**Seat Sale For Pendleton Show Opens Sept. 7th**

**PENDELTON, Ore., Aug. 19**—September 7 is the date set for the opening of the seat sale for the 1921 Round-Up, to be staged in Pendleton September 22, 23 and 24. Already demands are pouring in to the Round-up headquarters and the number of advance orders in unprecedented in the history of the big show. A section in the grandstand and three boxes have been ordered by the Oregon Journal for the 300 guests who as members of the annual "Journal Special" will visit the Round-Up.

Contracts have been closed by the Round-Up Association with Charles Irwin, who will be here with 20 cowboys and cowgirls and a string of fast horses. The famous Parsons string of race horses and those owned by Eddie McCarty will be here also. Yak and Kitty Canutt, Frank McCarrroll, Prairie Rose and John Judd—these and other celebrities of track and arena will compete in the events for cash prizes and trophies which make up the greatest prize list ever offered. Resplendent in hand-carved russet leather and trimmings of silver and gold, the \$500 saddle is awaiting the champion of the bucking contests, while the \$100 Police Gazette Belt with its solid gold engraved buckle will go to the champion all-around cowboy.

An array of nationally known persons will sit in the grandstands at the 12th annual show. Among these expected are A. Phimister Proctor, sculptor who recently completed an equestrian statue of Roosevelt which is to be presented to the city of Portland by Dr. Waldo Coe; Verne H. Porter, editor of the Cosmopolitan; Mary Roberts Rinehart, well-

known author, and Bebe Daniels, popular screen favorite. The Round-Up is purely a community affair, conducted on a non-profit basis by the Round-Up association which is made up of prominent Pendleton citizens, and as such it attracts thousands of visitors.

An additional attraction this year which will be of interest to wheatmen of the northwest is the Northwest Grain and Hay show to be held in Pendleton during Round-Up week. The show is open to the public and a \$1500 premium is the greatest ever offered for such products in the northwest, attracting the attention of wheat-growers.
