"Oregon Safety News" is the nam of a new publication whose mission is what the name implies, the spreading of the doctrine of safety first as a means of preventing industrial accidents. Following is an article from the Safety News, giving a few statistics of the loss through accidents in industries in Oregon every year:

The labor power destroyed in Oregon each year by industrial accidents is equivalent to the total labor power of a concern employing 5,107 workmen and operating 300 work-days during the year.

That's hard to believe, isn't it? Well, its true.

And here are the facts:

The average number of accidents under the compensation act each year during a period of four years for each kind of disability follows: 136 fatal and permanent total dis-

ability cases. 611 permanent partial disability
