## HOW COLLEGE STUDENTS EARN THEIR COURSES

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Aug. 23—(Special)—That practically every University of Oregon student is engaged in some kind of work this summer to help pay expenses for the next college year is revealed by a survey of their occupations of clerks among the workers. Salesmanship is another profession which recruits a good following from among University of Oregon students. Nearly all the major students in the School of Journalism are working on newspapers for the summer. Some are just starting out in their chosen profession as cub reporters and others are acting in editorial capacities. The department of physical education for women has a group of women students acting as playground directors for the summer. The great function of this school is to train physical education instructors and graduates of it have little difficulty in securing positions. In the forestry service are a number of men and women acting in various capacities. Five men are engaged in the work of the aerial forest patrol, one being liaison officer at the tions. The kind of work being done varies from salmon fishing in Alaska to flying with the aerial forest patrol in Oregon. A large number of the men are working in the harvest fields of the state. Not a few of the women, too, are engaged in some sort of agricultural work. One girl is running a tractor on her father's farm and says it is fun. Others are cooking for harvest hands, picking berries and working in orchards. Logging camps furnish work for a number of the men, although it is not thought that as many found employment at this work as during previous vacations. Sawmills also have a considerable number of University men in their employ this summer. Various kinds of construction camps claim their quota of workers from the student body as well. About equal numbers of men and women are working in offices. These include offices of banks, stores, doctors, state departments and general businesses. There are also a num-

Eugene headquarters and the other four observers. Two University women are acting as lookouts for forest fires from peaks in the Cascade mountains. Others of the group are acting as rangers, fire wardens and other forestry workers. Carpenter work is being done by several men and a few are working in blacksmith shops. Mechanical work, painting, garage work, railroad employment, truck driving, surveying and road work are some of the other manual occupations of the University men for the vacation period. Several men have gone to sea for the summer. It is estimated that 70 per cent of the students at the University of Oregon earn their own way either wholly or partly. Many find employment during the school year as well as in vacation time and in this way are able to pay their entire expenses. A free employment bureau is maintained by the campus Y. M. C. A., for the purpose of finding work for the students. The Y. W. C. A. also cooperates with the women students in finding positions.

## Sinnott's Former Secretary to Get Land Office Job

WASHINGTON, Aug. 23—Edward D. (Ned) Baldwin, of The Dalles, for several years secretary to Congressman Sinnott and for three years clerk to the public lands committee of the house, will be appointed to the vacancy in the Portland land office next February, when the term of the incumbent expires. He has been endorsed by both Oregon senators, and the appointment would have been announced with the other patronage information but for the fact that the vacancy does not occur till spring. Baldwin is regarded by the land office and interior department officials here as an expert and has on two occasions been unusually honored by the public lands committee by resolutions commending his work and special ability in land matters. Served as Secretary. He was for six years secretary of the Oregon Republican state committee and for some time acting chairman. His appointment has the endorsement not only of Senator McNary and Senator Stanfield, but also of the Oregon congressmen.
