COLORADO DIKE IS PROPOSED

EL CENTRO, Cal., Aug. 25.—The Colorado river must be put back where it belongs and kept there, if the Imperial Irrigation District is to thrive in the future, according to F. N. Cronholm, chief engineer and general manager for the district. At present, the southern portion of the Colorado, from a few miles below Yuma to where the waters enter the gulf of California, forms a delta similar in character to that of the Nile. When the river rises, it leaves the small cuts and channels that seam the delta lands, and wanders all over Lower California, sometimes threatening to break back along the irrigation system into the Imperial Valley, and always causing the land owners anxious hours and large expenditures for protection.

Mr. Cronholm told a recent meeting of the irrigation district directors that it would cost about \$2,800,000 to stop this trouble. His plans contemplate straightening the river channel, defining it so clearly that it will stop the river waters, and making assurance doubly sure by a constructing additional protective levees. At a cost of \$275,000 he would also divert the river into Pescadero basin, strengthening the three existing levees which lie between the principal streams and the valley lands, and would make a complete land and aerial survey of the whole Colorado river for the future guidance of flood fighters.

The total cost of these changes would be about three million dollars, Mr. Cronholm estimated. That is a lot of money, he said, but as the annual bill for preventing river ravages and repairing flood damages is close to ten per cent of that figure, it would pay eventually and in the mean time would end uncertainty about flood losses.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Aug. 25.—Horses may be passing from the stage, but horse lovers are still numerous. The Los Angeles city council is convinced of that. Recently the fire department released 18 old time steeds from service, motorizing the equipment having been finally completed. The council ordered the fire horses transferred to the engineering department to haul garbage wagons. Then came a tempestuous howl of protest from press, pulpit and public that swept the council from its course and landed the horses in a safe haven.

Four Federal Men Added to Forces Fighting Beetles

John M. Miller, F. P. Keen of San Francisco, J. E. Patterson and F. P. Pollock of Ashland, connected with the United States Bureau of Entomology, have arrived in this city to assist in the pine beetle control situation and will work in conjunction with A. E. Jaenicke, government expert sent here to investigate and outline the control campaign beginning in the spring. The detail of these men here to investigate the scene of their future activities means much to the owners of private timber for cruising of the infested areas can be made now and the notes taken for camp locations in the spring.
