BIG FREIGHT REDUCTIONS ARE COMING

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Sept. 2—Reductions of 20 to 100 per cent in transcontinental freight rates soon will be effective on all railroads. It was announced by W. G. Barnwell, assistant freight traffic manager of the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe railroad. Most of them apply to west-bound traffic, and are applicable from all eastern points.

The reductions, which are said to be voluntary, are as follows, the rates applying to all units of 100 pounds:

The present import rate on green coffee from Pacific Coast ports to eastern destinations, will be reduced from \$1.06 1/2 to 90 cents per 100 pounds, in carload lots, the minimum weight also to be reduced from 80,000 pounds to 40,000 pounds, and a special rate of 80 cents will also be published to Chicago and points west, with the higher minimum of 80,000 pounds. Before publishing the 90 cent rate, the concurrence of operating east of Chicago must be obtained.

Metal bottles, insulated or jacketed, less carload lots, will be given the same rating as glass bottles, the rate on which ranges from \$7.25 1/2 from New York and Atlantic seaboard to \$6.35 1/2 from Chicago, and \$4.69 from Denver, and will mean reduction of \$6.97 1/2 from New York, \$5.87 1/2 from Chicago and \$3.44 from Denver.

The present minimum weight of 40,000 pounds on carload shipments of leather from Chicago and points west to Pacific coast ports for export, is being reduced to 20,000.

Effective October 3, the following reductions in westbound transcontinental rates will be made:

Poultry feeders, waterers and poultry house scrapers will be reduced to \$2.58 1/2 from Atlantic seaboard, \$2.25 1/2 from Chicago, \$2.00 from Kansas City and \$1.87 1/2 from Denver, on carload shipments.

Gummed paper will be permitted shipment in mixed carloads with paper bags and wrapping paper, and rate will be reduced on carload lots to \$2.08 1/2 from Atlantic seaboard, \$1.75 1/2 from Chicago, \$1.66 1/2 from Kansas City and \$1.56 1/2 from Denver.

Strip steel will be reduced to \$3.00 less carload and \$1.83 1/2 carload

from Atlantic seaboard, \$2.56 L. C. L. and \$1.50 C. L. from Chicago, \$2.50 L. C. L. and \$1.25 1/2 C. L. from Kansas City, \$1.95 1/2 L. C. L. and \$1.17 1/2 C. L. from Denver.

Rosin sizing, in barrels, carload lots, will be reduced to \$1.60 1/2 per cwt. from Atlantic seaboard \$1.50 from Pittsburgh district, \$1.42 from Detroit district. Rate on shipments in tank cars will be .68 1/2 higher per hundred pounds than these rates.

New carload rates on furniture subject to certain valuation restriction will be published as follows:

Bedroom furniture, \$3.89 1/2 from Atlantic seaboard, \$3.55 1/2 from Chicago, \$3.33 1/2 from Kansas City and \$2.74 from Denver. Dining room furniture, \$3.57 1/2 from Atlantic seaboard, \$3.45 from Chicago, \$3.05 1/2 from Kansas City and \$2.50 from Denver.

Kitchen cabinets \$3.33 1/2 from Atlantic seaboard, \$2.92 from Chicago, \$2.66 1/2 from Kansas City and \$2.50 from Denver.

PLAN BIG COLISEUM

LOS ANGELES, Sept. 2—Construction work is expected to be begun here shortly on a coliseum at Exposition park to be used for community benefit. The structure is planned to seat 75,000 persons and to cost \$500,000. Civic officials say it will be among the largest structures of its kind in the world.
