Strong Teams of Grid Warriors are Promised This Year

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 7.—Football teams of the University of Oregon, University of Washington, Oregon Agricultural college and Washington state college are being strengthened and trained this year with the object of sending aggregations on to the field that will bring back to the north some of the laurels that were seized last season by the University of California and Stanford University.

It is predicted that Washington State will make a fight against the University of California that may bring victory to the north although the California aggregation is reported as strong as the one which last year was the sensation of football. The men whose playing last year carried the Washington State to the top in the northwest will be in the line-up this season with few exceptions. Gillis, powerful full-back, probably will be replaced by a youngster of promise named Hickey, and in addition to nearly a full roster of veterans, there is a strong squad of last year's freshmen striving for positions.

Although the University of Oregon has lost many regulars, including Bill Steers, redoubtable quarterback, a strong team is in prospect. Manerude may again return to school to repeat his successes as star quarter and marvelous kicker, and Charlie Parsons is expected to bring strength to the organization. Second-year men look very promising to the coach.

The Oregon Aggies are not saying much, but doing lots of work. Coach Rutherford is keeping his plans secret, and with Guy Rutherford, his assistant, is supposed to be making preparations for a team that will carry the fight to the enemy's goal and over.

The University of Washington which failed to win a game last year in the Pacific coast conference, has engaged Enoch Bagshaw as head coach, and he is instilling the do-or-die spirit into his material. He said they expected to "do."

Training Japanese in U. S. Citizenship

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 7.—The Japanese Y. M. C. A. in San Francisco is giving a two-weeks' course of lectures on Americanism for the training of Japanese men and women who wish to pass the examination required under the new California law of those seeking to teach in a

foreign language school. American history, American governmental attitude and American ideals will be covered in the lectures. The students will be told of the lives of great Americans, and America's educational institutions will be discussed.

The institute was opened with an address by Sam H. Cohn, assistant superintendent of public instruction, who has charge of the supervision of foreign language schools of California. Others who will lecture before the Japanese are: Miss Richardson of the state department of public instruction, Dr. H. H. Guy, Rev. P. B. Waterhouse, Prof. C. L. Rugh of the University of California and Dr. R. R. Perkins of the San Francisco Y. M. C. A.

Airplane Carrying Serum Saves Lives Of Four Children

SEATTLE, Wash., Sept. 7.—To save the lives of four children, an airplane recently raced 100 miles through fog and storm from Kent, Wash., to Yakima, Wash. It carried as its cargo, 20 drums of serum, which if administered in time, it was hoped would save the children from death of infantile paralysis. The airplane made its delivery in time.

Dr. Paul A. Turner of Seattle, state director of health, received a telegraph at 2 p. m. from Dr. H. H. Smith of Yakima asking for enough of the serum to save four children. He wanted it rushed. Dr. Turner examined a time table and saw that the railroad would be too late. He thought of the airplane. A police motorcycle with a burly father advancing its spark sped away to Kent with the serum, and at 3:35 Herbert Hunter's plane left the ground. He climbed 11,000 feet, above the clouds, and with the peak of Mt. Rainier guiding him flew away to the southeast. The ground was not sighted again until the Cascade mountains had been passed, but the life-giving fluid was delivered to Dr. Smith at 4:50 p. m.

Infantile paralysis has caused the death of more than 25 children in ten days in Washington state. To fight it, serum was rushed here from Rochester, Minn.
