**OREGON'S GREAT WOMEN? NAMES ARE WANTED**

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20.—Who were the great women in the history of Oregon?  
The woman's national foundation, adopting the suggestion of its executive head, Mrs. George Barnett, wife of Major General Barnett, commander of the United States marine corps, will include in its new civic home in Washington, D. C., a hall of remembrance to the famous women of America. In the hall will be a column for each state in the union and on these columns, state by state, will be engraved the names of the women whose achievements stand out. The selection of names for perpetuation is to be made by each state, first by a widespread general presentation and then by a state committee.  
**Names are Suggested**  
Several names for the Oregon column have been suggested. These include Mrs. Dorian, always her husband's companion when he acted as guide and interpreter for the early settlers in these once wild and dangerous regions; Mrs. A. R. Riggs and Mrs. Lucia Faxton Additon, temperance workers and philanthropists, and the great suffragist, Mrs. Abigail Scott Duniway.  
The foundation asks that all interested—club women, teachers, students and historians—send to the Woman's national foundation, Connecticut avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C., the names of the women they believe should be included in the Oregon list. Each name should be ac-

companied by a biography why the name should be included. Women now living are excluded.  
**Buildings to be Erected**  
The hall of remembrance is to be one of a group of buildings that will be a clearing-house for all women's activities, reference libraries, a woman's hotel, etc. The foundation is all inclusive and non-partisan. It has acquired an eleven-acre site, valued at \$1,000,000. The buildings, when completed, will have a value of \$2,500,000.  
Among the nationally known women associated with Mrs. Barnett are Mrs. John Hays Hammond, Mrs. Clarence Crittenden Calhoun and Mrs. Stephen B. Elkins.
