#### 20,000 Head of Lambs Purchased

Watt, DeLap and Vettel report the purchase of 20,000 head of lambs from Klamath county growers in the last few days. The fat ones will be shipped at once to Moffatt & Co., in San Francisco. The others will be fed in Klamath until they are ready for market.

The lambs were bought for \$5.50 a hundred, prices per head ranging from \$2.75 to \$4.75, depending on weight and condition.

Some thousand head of cattle were also purchased. About half have been shipped and the others will follow. The top price for steers was 5 1/2 cents.
