WEED TO K. F. ROAD WILL BE CONSTRUCTED

DORRIS, Sept. 24.—A new highway for Superior California leading from the Pacific highway at Weed

to Klamath Falls, Ore., and through the scenic attractions of Crater Lake National park in Klamath county, is now assured. This road will be constructed for an all-year highway, and will eliminate many miles of mountain road now in use via Topsey grade.

Members of the Klamath county court and the Siskiyou county supervisors, together with citizens from both Klamath and Siskiyou counties interested in this proposed highway, met at Klamath Falls last week and decided upon the Weed to Klamath Falls route through Butte valley in preference to the old Topsey grade road.

From Weed north to Bray \$10,000 has already been spent by the Weed Lumber company in putting that end of the highway in good condition. It was understood at the Klamath conference that the two counties would build their respective portions as soon as possible, thus completing a short cut for tourists into the scenic wonderland of these two counties before automobile travel begins next summer.

Annually thousands of automobiles from California and other western states traverse the difficult roads leading into the Crater Lake National park and the Modoc lava beds in Siskiyou and Modoc counties. Fishing and hunting are the principal attractions that draw tourists into this country, but the unexcelled beauties of mountainous scenery, lakes and streams is the incentive for many auto parties that each year spend a vacation here.

In laying out the route for the new highway several bad mountain climbs will be eliminated, including Haystack Hill. Not only will this new highway prove a great asset to this locality in tourist travel, but it will enable local people to reach the outside by automobile during twelve months of the year, a thing now impossible.
