## URGES WOMEN TO TAKE HAND IN GOVERNMENT

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich., Oct. 24.—An appeal to American women to form and express public opinions upon pertinent questions was voiced here by Mrs. Percy V. Pennybacker, of Austin, Texas, before the annual convention of the Michigan Federation of Women's clubs. Mrs. Pennybacker is a past president of the General Federation of Women's clubs, a national organization.

"There can be no true national prosperity in a republic without an intelligent public opinion and there can be no such opinion without individual efforts," Mrs. Pennybacker said.

"Too many persons are prone to take their opinions ready made their opinions for newspaper headlines or from friends or relatives in whom they have confidence. No woman has the right to give as her opinion the opinion of another, not even of her husband."

"Her country demands her own opinion and not that of another. Three steps are necessary for building of a real opinion. These are reading, talking with others, and thinking."

"Facts are needed as the foundation stones on which to form an opinion and thoughtful, digestive reading is vital. All sides of a question must be considered before the opinion is built. If we are to form an opinion that we may defend we must sit in judgment and let the arguments pass before us."

"It is necessary to talk with many persons of all minds and all walks of life. We may read and talk eternally, but without thought our duty is not done. We must make our own opinions, pass in review and challenge each before Sweden."

the bar of reason and conscience. Duty demands that we speak out when proper occasion offers or permits.

"Women have a great responsibility with regard to the topics of conversation in the family circle. Nothing can be made more intellectual than table talk. Every skilled teacher easily selects the children who come from homes where intelligent conversation is the rule. These boys and girls have a fund of general information, an outlook upon life, and a breadth of vision that is invaluable."

The speaker declared one of the advantages of women suffrage was the educational effect upon conversation between men and women. She also stressed the importance of expressing opinions in a dignified manner, without venom. Much of the lack of reverence for law and authority on the part of the youth of the country, she said, can be traced to utterances of parents in the home.

Mrs. Pennybacker declared two duties confronted American women, "to teach Americans that immigrants bear gifts if we are but wise enough to see them," and "that it is not best that the immigrant should live within himself."

Referring to the latter duty the speaker declared the policy of permitting aliens to live in colonies, away from Americanizing influences, was wrong.

### Claims New Record In 500 Meter Swim

ALAMEDA, Cal., Oct. 24.—Claims for a new world's record in the 500-meter swim will be made to the international record committee for Ludy Langer, former University of California star, who last Sunday swam the distance in 6 minutes 48 and 2-5 seconds here.

At present the recognized record, held by Norman Ross, is 6 minutes, 55 and 4-5 seconds. Pending before the record committee is a mark of 6 minutes 49 and 3-5 seconds made by Erlie Borg of Sweden.
