Road Into Lassen Park Is Selected

REDDING, Cal., Oct. 27.—Selection of a portion of a route for a scenic highway through the recently created Mount Lassen National Park, near here, is being made by M. E. Dittmar, of Redding, known as the "father of the Lassen Park."

Many isolated parts of the park, now seldom visited, will be opened up by the road, which, for a great part of the distance, will follow an old immigrant trail from Reno to

the pioneer mining settlement of Shasta, near here.

Mount Lassen, the only active volcano in the continental United States, is only one of the wonders of the park, according to Dittmar, who recently spent several weeks visiting wild and remote portions of the reservation.

No Elasticity In Japanese Base Ball Contests

SEATTLE, Wn., Oct. 27.—Baseballs used in Japan are so "dead" it is almost impossible to knock them out of the infield, according to a letter received here from Ross Stokke, manager of the Canadian Stars, a team of Seattle and Vancouver, B. C., semi-professionals, now playing in Japan.

"Live" balls are not to be had in Japan, the letter said, and the Japanese insist that the Japanese-made balls be used, instead of balls brought by the Americans.

The Canadian Stars, up to September 14, when the letter was written, had won five and lost one game.
