### Yosemite Cafeteria Declared Success

YOSEMITE, Cal., Oct. 28. - / cafeteria in the Yosemite National Park, miles from the big cities where tray carriers generally are found, this year apparently solved a problem of furnishing food at medium prices for tourists far from a railroad. During the last five months, approximately 250,000 meals were served at an average cost of about 48 cents each.

The cafeteria was the first ever established in any national park and it has been so successful that other parks have written for details of its operations. It is probable that the idea will be copied.

Secretary Fall of the Department of the Interior, while here this summer, became a tray carrier at the cafeteria and declared thought the establishment was a step in the right direction to provide good accommodations at the r lowest possible prices.

Food served in the cafeteria is the same quality as that served in Yosemite's American plan resorts charging as high as \$7.50 and \$10 per day. The prices differ little from those in cafeterias in San Francisco and Los Angeles. The food is sold at cost, as employes of the National Park company make up about half the cafeteria's pat-
