**Wireless Used by
Y. M. C. A. to send
Weather Forecast**

PORTLAND, Oct. 31.—The Portland branch of the Y. M. C. A. today initiated a system of weather forecast distribution throughout Oregon and Washington by wireless.

The distribution is made for a radius of 1500 miles by arrangement with the United States weather bureau here.

The forecasts started today at 9 o'clock and were for the succeeding 36 hours. Special warnings are also sent out at 3 o'clock in the afternoon

from the "Y" station, provided any are received before that hour.

The "Y" uses both telephone and telegraph for the service by wireless, with 2W rating and a wave length of 375 meters. The call is 7YG. Amateur wireless operators, both telephone and telegraph, are said to be giving the service a wide local distribution.

**GOVERNMENT DISTRIBUTES
1918 EXCESS WOOL PROFITS**

WASHINGTON, Oct. 31.—In its work of distributing to growers the 1918 excess wool profits collected from dealers, the United States Department of Agriculture, during

the month of September disbursed \$23,045.56 and mailed out 7,781 checks. There still remains on hand for distribution \$336,731.94, of which \$1,339.49 was collected during the past month. In addition, cases awaiting settlement involve the sum of \$659,019.41.

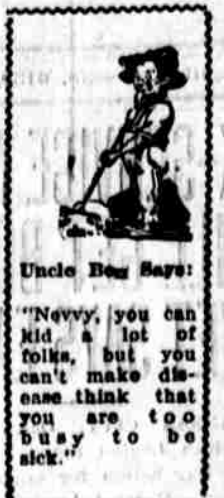
