CALIFORNIA NEWS

MARYSVILLE—T. Syvertson and wife have filed suit in the Superior Court against Emile and Albert E. Hansen, who operate a laundry adjoining the home of the plaintiffs on B street, seeking \$1,000 damages because of soot and oil entering their home. Plaintiffs ask that the Hosenes be enjoined from operating the laundry because of the noise made in the running of the machinery, and because the whistle is too shrill, all of which are alleged to disturb the peace and quietude of the Syvertson home.

SACRAMENTO—Four children were painfully burned about the face and hands and two women injured when a dozen or so toy balloons used to decorate the Douglas Hill home, 3701 G Street, for a birthday party for little Cerita Hill, exploded. They were accidentally ignited from a candle that was being used to light little Jack O'Lanterns, and it was the flames which leaped from the bursting balloons that burned the little tots.

SACRAMENTO—Children of parents who object to any form of dancing because of religious scruples cannot be forced to participate in them when they are included in the physical training exercises at the public schools. It was held in an opinion handed down Friday in the Third District Court of Appeal.

WOODLAND—Four truckmen of Sacramento were fined \$10 each by Justice of the Peace W. H. Womack of Winers for hauling loads over the county highway greater than that allowed by county ordinance. They were J. Simpson, William Orr, L. P. Samson and A. Anderson.
