OREGON BREVITIES

ROSEBURG—The heavy rains of the last few days resulted in a bad break in the paved highway just south of Roseburg. The foundation became softened and slid away leaving the pavement suspended. Later a large portion of this hard surface broke down.

SALEM—A total of 10,305 ex-service men entitled to benefits under the so-called bonus law had filed applications with the world war veterans' state aid commission tonight. Of the aggregate applications \$614 seek cash bonuses and 4691 loans. The commission will meet here Monday, when a large number of the

applications will receive consideration.

BEND—Meeting at the home of Paul Lore, local civil service employee organized the Bend Postoffice Employee Social and Card club. Bi-weekly gatherings are planned, with Thursdays decided on for the club's parties.

PENDLETON—The state highway commission is provoked with the action of Pendleton's Commercial association in threatening to boycott the 1932 exposition unless the Portland Chamber of Commerce refrains from endorsing the Umatilla-Wallula cut-off, according to members of the county court, who are home from a meeting of the commission.

ROSEBURG—Unless other counties took to the increased fish and game licenses better than Douglas county, the state lost considerable

money by making an increase in the amount charged for these licenses. According to figures compiled by County Clerk I. B. Riddle, the amount paid for game licenses has greatly decreased this year over the past years, in spite of the fact that the license fee is twice as much as before.

SALEM—It was announced here that T. B. Handley, state corporation commissioner, had revoked the permit of the Portland-Texas Oil company, with headquarters in Portland, to sell stock in the concern pending an audit of the books of the company and a complete reorganization of the corporation's affairs.
