An electric motor that runs at such slow speed that it is noiseless has been invented for phonographs.

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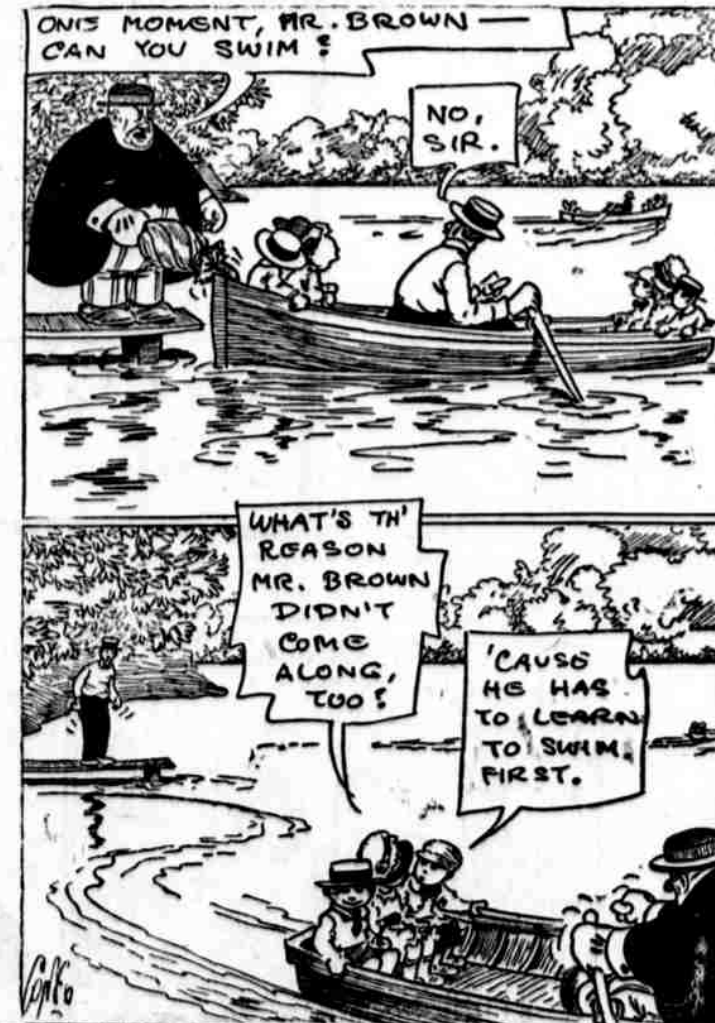
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
