PORTLAND RAPS

(Roseburg News-Review) The Roseburg Chamber of Commerce has for two years been protesting against the inclusion of Diamond Lake in the proposed enlargement of the Crater Lake area. This subject has been given considerable thought by the Merchants Association of the Chamber of Commerce, and resolutions protesting against the inclusion of more of Douglas county territory in the Crater Lake park with its severe restrictions have been sent to the Oregon representatives in Congress and other organizations. The Klamath Wool Growers' association, the Bend Commercial Club and ether influential bodies, foined in the protests.

Hearings were held by subcom mittees of the Portland Chamber and the data submitted to them was laid before the entire Board of Directors and after viewing the subject and the proposed Senate bill from all angles, they have adepted the following resolutions, which are very clear and specific and set out clearly the reasons for their action.

WHEREAS a bill to extend the boundaries of Crater Lake National Park, so as to include Diamond Lake and vicinity within said National Park is before Congress;

WHEREAS said Diamond Lake ecuntry is now under the supervision of the Forestry Service and, being under this service, is open te the public with fewer restrictions than it would be under the National Park Service; and

WHEREAS the Forestry Service is not restricted by appropriations for any particular project and, therefore, has more freedom in developing sections of the country most · needing development; and

WHEREAS under the control of this Service the natural resources of this section, such as the cutting of ripe timber, the acquisition of power sites, etc., would continue to

be open to the public; and WHEREAS under the Forestry Service there are fewer restrictions on the use of this land for recreation purposes than under the National Park Service; and

WHEREAS Diamond Lake is a natural reservoir for storing and regulating the flow of the North Umpqua River, the power of which river will at some future time be developed to supply electric energy for that part of the state; and

WHEREAS the inclusion of this rritory in the Crater Lake tional Park would preclude this power development for all time; and

WHEREAS in general it is believed to have this section remain under the Forestry Service ag it now is; therefore leaving it more free for future development both as to recreation purposes and the development of its natural resources; therefore be it

RESOLVED by the Chamber of Commerce that this body is against the inclusion of Diamond Lake and continguous country in Crater Lake National Park; and be it further

RESOLVED that copies of these resolutions be sent to the Chambers directly interested, and to the Oregon Delegation in Congress.

"We desire that the administra-tion of the Diamond Lake country remain under the jurisdiction of the Agricultural Department and administered by the Forestry Service, and we are asking that the funds which have been withheld pending this controversy be now turned over to the Agricultural Department for completion of im provements in the Diamond Lake territory," the secretary of the lecal chamber says.

The Forestry Service is completing a first class road South of Diamond Lake to the North boundary of the Crater Lake territory, and the Crater Lake Park is working on the Crater Lake trail to the North boundary connecting the Forestry read. Diamond Lake is one of the wonder spots and recreation parks of Douglas county and when the Tiller Cut-Off is completed will save 55 miles in reaching these beautiful lakes.
