OREGON BREVITIES

Success on Replanted Land
PORTLAND. — Replanted areas on the old Cispus burn on the Rainier national forest in Washington are running more than 90 per cent successful, says J. E. Kummel, forest examiner in charge of the planting work of the United States forest service.

Oppose Chain Gang
PENDLETON. — Organized labor in Pendleton has taken a definite stand against the use of a city chain gang and has obtained from the city council the promise that the chain gang will be operated only on forced work.

Bear Killing Stock
TOLDO. — A score or more of sheep and goats have been killed by bears in Lincoln county during the past week. As a result, the farmers have begun a series of intensive hunts, with the views of eradicating as many of the bears as possible.

Falls Robber, Though Wounded
PORTLAND. — In spite of a severe blow on the head from a maul handle in the hands of a highwayman August Wagner, proprietor of a soft drink stand at Twelfth and Olive streets, grappled with the robber and finally drove him away. Wagner had just returned from the bank with a quantity of money to be used in cashing pay checks for workmen in that neighborhood.

Encounter With Panther
MARSHFIELD. — Pat Lundy, an employe at the Coos river salmon hatchery, faced death twice during a pursuit of a large panther which he finally killed. The first time Lundy escaped from the beast as it jumped from a tree before him. Lundy stepped back to have more room to fire and fell over a log. The dog chased the animal away.

Short Weight Butchers Fined
PORTLAND. — Nathaniel G. Davis and Barie Maris, butchers, were fined \$5 each in municipal court Friday on a charge of selling hams of short weight, on complaint of E. B. Jones, deputy sealer. They said the hams were weighed when received and that the difference was due to natural shrinkage.

Many Stolen Autos Recovered
PORTLAND. — Out of 51 automobiles reported stolen in the month of October, 46 were recovered, according to a report compiled Friday of the activities of the auto theft bureau of the Portland police department. An increase in both thefts and percentage of recoveries is shown in comparison with the figures for October 1920.

Str Bootlegger Fined
SEASONS. — Justice of the Peace Hasen inflicted a total of \$480 fines to three alleged violators of the prohibition law at his session of the court Friday. Esther Paulsen, aged about 20, was fined \$50 for her share in the liquor manufacture carried at the Paulsen ranch near Globe.

Ashland Ousts Hoboes
ASHLAND. — Thirty-six hoboes are headed south from here after staging a small riot and being stopped for investigation just outside the city limits Saturday.

Wages Drop in Bend
BEND. — Following the downward trend of wages, the rate for common labor in Bend dropped a dollar a day when the city council, at its regular meeting, made four dollars for eight hours the standard. During the previous months of the administration five dollars had been the minimum.

Roads in Good Shape
TILLAMOOK. — During the last year Tillamook county expended considerable money improving the main highway through the county, having completed several road projects that were under way for several years. The roads in the county were never in better shape.

Sheriff Rebels
PENDLETON. — Sheriff Zoeth Houser of Umatilla county has refused to chase moonshiners and run down bootleggers until the county court agrees to pay the costs of such work. The sheriff asserts he has spent \$800 of his own money this year in pursuit and capture of criminals, and refuses longer to do so. He has brought action in the supreme court to compel payment.
